Psalm 119: 9-16.

9- "How can a young man or woman keep their way pure?

By living according to Your word.

10- I seek You with all my heart;

do not let me stray from Your commands.

11- I have hidden Your word in my heart

that I might not sin against You.

12- Praise be to You O Lord;

teach me Your decrees.

13- With my lips I recount

all the laws that come from Your mouth.

14- I rejoice in following Your statutes

as one who rejoices in great riches.

15- I meditate on Your precepts

and consider Your ways.

16- I delight in Your decrees;

I will not neglect Your word."

Not neglect Your word! What a powerful statement!

My letter today was going to be about how God directs us through His word and wants us to take care of each day and not worry about tomorrow. Matthew 6: 34, Jesus tells us, "to not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself." He will direct us daily as to how we face each day.
