When we moved into our home 38 years ago, there was an old and massive lilac bush chained to the side of the house. The blooms were a beautiful and rare color of magenta. I trimmed and cared for it for

many years. However, about 10 years ago, because of a severe storm, it blew over, broke off, and died. I removed the last of the bush and roots and Donita and I decided to fill in the spot with flowers. Five years later, as I was preparing the ground for more flowers, I noticed a shoot coming up out of the ground. Sure enough, it was a shoot from the lilac bush, pushing its way up through the soil. It was a totally unexpected and joyful surprise.

Jesse was King David's father, and his descendants were to rule forever. But when they failed, it was as if the family tree of Jesse, like our lilac bush, was cut off and lost forever. But in God's perfect time, He sent another descendant in the form of a tiny baby. And from this new Branch would sprout the Messiah, our Savior Jesus the Christ.

I have protected our shoot for over 5 years, and it is now 2 feet tall. I'm hoping a branch will "bear fruit" next spring. Likewise, God's Will, through Jesus, was for Him to bear fruit; the fruit of life that springs up ever eternal.
