As Donita and I were sitting on our patio watching the eclipse, a few thoughts ran through my mind. I also received a short article that was sent to me by Bill Freytag. I will condense them here for your consideration.

First, I'm sure millions of people yesterday witnessed the moon pass directly between the sun and the earth. How many actually considered or gave even a moment of thought toward the Creator who placed the sun, moon, and our home in perfect positions that allow life as we know it to exist? If our world was just a few degrees away or closer to the sun, there would be no life. We cannot possibly know God's mind, but only see and marvel at His grandeur and wisdom. Events like this are God's way of reminding us that He is God and we are not. We need to keep our eyes and minds open to the thousands of ways that He shows us His omnipotence every day.

And second. Many in the world are unknowingly "stuck" in the shadow of the eclipse. What do I mean? Many ask the question, "Why am I here?" The one true answer to life's biggest question is found in Colossians 1:16. Paul reminds us that, "we are all created by God, and for God." And each of us is an awe-inspiring and magnificent creation that also displays His power and might.

However, there are times when our lives can turn dark. Our hearts can be broken, sadness overwhelms us, and even fear can overshadow us. Let's face it, we all can get lost in the dark. Especially when something

comes in the way of our light source. So, what gets in the way of the light? Isaiah 59:2 tells us, "Your sins have separated you from your God." In other words, we try to run our lives the way we want, ignoring all that our loving God has provided. And what happens? We end up in darkness. A darkness just like we experienced when the moon blocked the sun.

But here is our hope. Remember the "I Am" statements over Lent? Jesus says, "I Am the light of the world." John 8:12. Think of God's Son as the sun. The moon is our sins. What can we do to let the sun shine on us again? We must allow Jesus into our hearts. In darkness on that Good Friday, Jesus took all our sins on Himself. He paid our death penalty, and then returned three days later, defeating death and sin. If we repent and allow Jesus into our hearts, our sins are removed and the Son will be able to shine His light on us.

Why would He do this? Paul, I think, says it best. In Galatians 2:20 he says, "He loved me (and yes, that's also you and I) and gave Himself for me." Without Jesus, we all would be in a total eclipse, and eternal darkness. But with Him, we will be in His eternal light and eternal life!

Praise God, Jesus is Risen Indeed!
