From your Pastor

Dear Members and Friends,

For those who haven't heard, we have recently experienced a Theological incident of near Biblical proportions.

While mowing, George noticed what appeared to be the Ohio River flowing from the front porch of our house. (yes, I am using a bit of hyperbole here) Upon inspection, he discovered that a water line in the upstairs bathroom had broken, and water flowed unchecked throughout the house for at least 2 days. The damage to the house and contents was severe, to say the least. (Hence, my "near Biblical proportions" statement above.)

Please be assured that the insurance company, adjustors, and all appropriate people have been contacted. The severity of the damage was so extreme that the house will be torn down and removed in the near future.

But store up for yourselves treasures in Heaven. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." I think these words speak for themselves but they also speak directly to us. My question to you is, will we lament over lost items or will we choose to see God's hand at work in our lives?

My prayer is that we may see this not as something negative, but as a positive sign that God has a plan for us, is clearing a new path for us, is preparing us for something new, something exciting, and something we can't even imagine. And that this plan has nothing to do with "things", but has everything to do with expanding His Kingdom on earth, and storing up treasures in Heaven.
