Often, I hear how a smile appears on a face or a tear of joy traces down a cheek after having the card read. And the smiles and tears don't always come from the resident, but can come from the nurse, the aid, the doctor, and even a family member or friend who happens to be visiting.

This is one of the reasons the Elders would like us to expand our card ministry by beginning to regularly visit those who can't always be with us. Our goal is for each person to visit 2 different people each month. That way, you will have visited 24 different folks in a year, and each person will have been visited by at least 12 members in a year. What a comfort and what a joy we will be able to bring to each other; the reconnecting with friends, and the making of new friends.

Allow me to leave you with some of Paul's words to the Corinthians, and to us. "The Father of compassion and comfort comforts us in our troubles, so that we can comfort others with the same comfort that we ourselves have received from God." 2 Cor. 1:3-4. I hope that you will prayerfully consider becoming a visitor, and spread the joy and comfort given to us by our loving and caring God.
