I was listening to one of my favorite singers from the 60's and 70's today and a line in one of his classic hits jumped out and got me thinking about the answer.

We all have found ourselves in situations where we either think there is no way out, or no chance for a pardon, let alone forgiveness. Imagine Peter's inner struggle when he sees Jesus that first evening. There is joy mixed with guilt and shame! Jesus returns a week later and Peter's struggle intensifies! He then sees Jesus for a third time on the shore of the sea of Galilee. Everyone around him is happy that Jesus is alive. But Peter can only remember how he abandoned and denied Him. I can only imagine the hopeless, sinking feeling he must have felt when Jesus says, "Hey Peter, let's take a walk." Peter thinks, "Ok, this is the end. First, He's going to lecture me, then He will tell me to pack my bags, and never show my face around here again. And honestly, I don't blame Him in the least."

However, to Peter's surprise Jesus asks him not once but 3 times, "Do you love Me?" Peter is taken aback. He utters, "Love You? Love You?! Of course, I love You!!" Jesus then reminds Peter as to why he is one of His chosen. "Peter, you are to tend My sheep, my lambs, and to follow Me." John 21: 15-19.

Jesus, our Lord brings forgiveness to all who are broken. To all who feel abandoned and lost. And because of His love for us, all we need to do is, like the song says, "ask for another chance." Even when it feels as if we are in the darkest of times, we will always be welcomed back into Jesus' loving arms through our confession and repentance. And that is the promise of Easter!
