And speaking of trains. One evening a number of years ago, Donita and I went over to her parent's house for a visit. When we arrived, we found her father and his best friend down on the living room floor playing with an old electric train set that was found in a garage. Well playing isn't quite the right word. You see, the train would not run. The transformer was plugged in, wires from the transformer were secured to the track, the track was together in a complete circuit, but the train received no power. They oiled wheels, jiggled parts, sanded contacts, and cleaned every surface they could find but it just wouldn't run. Finally they decided it was hopeless and were going to throw it away. It was a beautiful 1930's passenger train and I asked if I could have it. (I think Donita might have rolled her eyes). The next day, I carefully took the engine apart and inspected every part there was. I about gave up myself when I noticed 2 small wires, one on top of the other, each going to its own connection. Using a toothpick I cleaned between the wires and discovered that the bottom wire had come loose. I soldered it back in place and the train powered back to life. You see, without the wire being connected to a source of power, the train was just a useless piece of metal.

The same is true with us. In John 15:5, Jesus tells the disciples "I am the vine, you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit." But then He added, "Apart from Me, you can do nothing."

This teaching was given in a grape growing region, where the disciples would have known exactly what Jesus was getting at. Grapevines are hardy plants, and can take severe pruning. However, if the branch is cut off from the life source, the branches are worthless, just pieces of deadwood. It is the same with us.

If we remain in Jesus and let his words live in us, then we stay "wired" to our source of life, so that "we can bear much fruit, and show yourselves to be my disciples." (vrs.8) We like the train, need to stay connected to our power source. And the power comes from Jesus through the scriptures, prayer, and His love. So stay plugged in and let the power flow!
