First, I would like to thank all of you for your kind words concerning last Sunday's message. It is indeed an honor and a privilege to be able to bring God's perfect word to you each week.

There was one facet of John 20: 1-18 that I didn't get to elaborate on. It was about being a witness. I pointed out in our reading from the book of Acts that Peter, while speaking at Cornelius' house, brought up twice that he was a witness. And yes he was. However, in John 20: 1-18, the only thing Peter was a witness to was an empty tomb, and folded up fabric.

John wrote and showed that 2 men were witnesses. The reason for this is that Jewish law, the Torah, stated there must be two witnesses, and they must be male adults. Women were never permitted to be witnesses. I have no doubt that Peter and "the one Jesus loved" were the first to look inside the tomb, to "believe", and to return and tell the others what they had found. However, neither saw the Risen Christ until later that day.

So, who is the true witness here? Hmmm? Let's think! Right! It's Mary Magdalene! What was it she said? "I have 'SEEN' the Lord!" That is a witness! An eye witness! Mary however, is a

single woman and she is all alone. That goes against the law of the Torah; the law of man.

Don't you just love our God? He never follows man's ways, but His own, perfect way! On top of that, He entrusts the most important tasks to those who always say "I'm not worthy!"

Look at Jacob, a scoundrel entrusted in founding and bringing together a nation. Moses, who after running away led God's people to the Promised Land. David, a young boy, was used to slay the enemy and go on to be a great King. Shepherds were used to announce the birth of the Messiah. Even Saul of Tarsus, a killer of Christians, becomes one of the greatest Apostles of all time! And here, He uses Mary, an absolute nobody, to be the first to announce that He Has Risen! An eye witness to greatness!

I think we all often write ourselves off as "not being qualified or worthy." But God disagrees. Qualifications have nothing to do with what He wants us to do. We are to interact with those who need to be loved, and cared for, and to explain to them the good news of the Gospel. (If you don't believe that, I refer you again to the list above.) God will always place you where He wants you, and will always give you the tools and words to use, at the right time. The only thing you need to do is have faith, courage, and keep your eyes and ears open. When God sends someone your way, (and He will) He will provide everything you need to offer them His love and saving grace; to be a witness!
