About a year ago, I read about an experiment concerning seeds. Knowing what Alan will be speaking about this coming Sunday, I feel this is the perfect time to tell this story.

In 1879, a botany professor by the name of William Beal filled 20 bottles with various seeds then dug deep into the soil and buried them. Once buried, one of the bottles would be dug up every twenty years and the seeds planted. His reason? He wanted to see which seeds could withstand lying dormant over long periods of time, be planted, germinate, grow, and become viable for food. Imagine an experiment that would take centuries to complete.

Now fast forward to the year 2021. Yes, just 2 years ago the seventh of Professor Beal's twenty bottles was dug up and the seeds planted. After over 140 years, some of the seeds did sprout, survive, and thrive.

Matthew, Mark, and Luke all tell the story of the Sower of the seed. Jesus spoke a lot about seed planting, especially comparing it to the sowing and spreading the seed of "the word."
