Growing up, I remember that when something broke and needed fixed, you thought through the problem, talked it over with someone, and came up with a solution. A flat tire on your bike meant a trip to Western Auto for a patch kit. The person behind the counter showed you what to do, so you went home and patched the tube; problem solved. When you are scared and don't know what to say, the Spirit is there and will give you the words that need to be said. That is a promise from God. We all need to pray this prayer of Paul's. Let God know that you feel inadequate. Because when you do, that opens you up to the Holy Spirit, and the Spirit will take over and the "words will be given to you, so you can proclaim fearlessly the Gospel."

Remember, you are never alone and should never fear speaking with others because the Holy Spirit lives in you. The words you speak are actually coming from the heart of God, and through your voice, to the heart of someone who really needs to hear them!
