Our stained-glass window in the front of our sanctuary, shows Jesus knocking at the door. Remember, He can't enter because there is no door knob on His side. It is up to us to open the door and invite Him in.

Paul, in Colossians 2, verse 6 says, "So then, just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord..." (Well first, I hope you have answered the door and invited Him in.) Now, the rest of the verse reads, "...continue to live in Him." What that means is, after you have invited Him in, do you leave Him just inside the door, or do you invite Him deeper inside your house; Into more and more rooms.

I think some of us may leave Him just inside the door. Let's face it, most of us have, shall we say, messy rooms in our lives. Maybe you are afraid to let Him see that you still feel lonely or depressed. Or maybe you have some old problem that you have been hiding and are still dealing with. The point of this verse? Once you have invited Him in, don't leave Him standing alone. Offer Him your whole life, messes and all. Remember, we are children of God, and Jesus is family. By trusting and taking Jesus deeper into our lives, we will become closer to Him. And the closer we become, the greater joy, love, and peace we will have.

So, watch out for door to door salesmen, but be sure to welcome Jesus deep into your heart and home.
