In a world that is increasingly more dangerous and unpredictable, security is something that seems to be in short supply. I think we all are looking for such a protector.

Well take heart! We all have such a protector, have such a Father. He is the one who created us and loves us deeply. And He wants us to love Him also. If we do, we will never lose Him or His love. This is His promise; "Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have summoned you by name; you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; when you pass through the rivers, they will not sweep over you. When you walk through the fire, you will not be burned, . . . for I am the Lord, your God." Isaiah 43:1-3. If the Lord is your God, you will always have His security and His protection, from the very moment you believe, all the way until eternity. So, when you find yourself afraid and seemingly alone in the dark, remember our Heavenly Father's unbreakable promise in Hebrews 13:5, "Never will I leave you. Never will I forsake you." Know that He is always there with you, standing guard over you, and always close enough to protect you from harm.
